Harold Jefferies is an artist working at the Little City Foundation art studios, outside Chicago, a program for artists with developmental disabilities. He has been making his own money for years. Harold will be drawing money and making exchanges with visitors. "You're Gonna Miss Me" is a documentary about rock n roll pioneer Roky Erickson, whose band the 13th Floor Elevators coined the term "psychedelic rock" in the 60s. This film tells the story of Erikson's family and their struggle to care for Roky, who suffers from schizophrenia.
